
FAQ: Can a BSB use a magic lance?

You cannot use a mundane lance as this is mundane equipment.
It is not possible to use mundane equipment for a BSB.(except barded warhorse)

However a lance is a weapon that is used in one hand.
So the BSB can use Magic equipment that does not require 2 hands to use.

A magic lance is not forbidden by the rules to be used by a BSB.

Even if it was a 2handed weapon as a mundane weapon ,
page 121 of the 7th edition rulebook(page 152 of the BRB) states in the section about Magic Weapons:
I paraphrase:
Magic Weapons allways ignore all special rules that would apply to normal weapons.
All rules that apply are covered in the magic weapon description.

So in effect all magic weapons are basic (Hand) weapons with special properties, no matter how it is named

So if it doesn't say so in the magic weapon description even a greataxe isnt a 2 handed weapon. You could even use a lance on foot if it wasn't specific ruled out in the description.
All lance in the Bretonnia magic weaponsection could be used on foot, but the +2 strength bonus only applies when mounted and on the charge.

Q) I believe the rule is,if he couldn't be equipped with a mundane version,then he cannot be equipped with a magical one?

A) No That rule is in the magic armour section of page 121, not in the magic weapon section.

Q) Well theoretically it coul be handed so, but practically I can not imagine that he could charge effectively with the lance.

A)This is the rules section according to the rules it is allowed, in real life, it's probably not the best way to fight but warhammer isn't Real life

Q)The rule for the BSB, on page 67 of the Army Book,states he may not be given any extra equipment,except his warhorse/mount.That includes lances,GWs,morningstars,and shields. So how about it?

A) That rule is about mundane equipment, not magical equipment he has an point allowance for this just as any Paladin.(page 67 ArmyBook)

Q According to the written rules it is allowed.
But atleast in my gaming community having a BSB with two gigantic poles in each hand is frowned upon. It looks silly

A) Maybe it looks silly but taste varies a lot This is however a rules forum.
So ruleswise there isn't a problem.

Q)I care about WYSIWYG (What you see is what you get), so I'd never take a BSB with a magic lance. It's effective though.. so I can understand why some people use it.

A) it is entirely possible to model a lance on the BSB.
But while some groups and torunaments rules are strict on WYSIWYG, magical equipment on characters and magical banners are the exception on those rules.

Magic items are generally secret untill used.
Modelling each Magic weapon in detail could give away information then that the opponent ought to have.

For groups and tournaments that use stricter WYSIWYG rules use house rules.
That is their good right of course, but it falls outside the scope of this rules forum.

I have given the prove above, so you can deduce a BSB can use a magic lance.
If you put up self imposed restriction well that's another story.
With the restrictions (which are not mentioned in the rulesbook BTW) you point out, you can't.

Luckily for me this is a rules discussion not a house rule discussion.

For the record if you say you can't use buy magic equipment which a BSB can't buy as mundane option, the only option for a BSB would be a magic horse or magic barding.
Both of which do not exist in our present armybook.

So I go with your reasoning for a moment
A BSB doesn't have the option of buying a handweapon so why can he buy a magic version?
BSB is equiped with it so he can't buy it.

But the requirement for using magic armour is that you can use the mundane version.
For wepons? I believe GW had included that line if they had intended that.
Or they will errata it soon enough. Untill that time the rules

For example: A Darkelves Sorceress can use a magic crossbow which she can't use as a mundane version. I have seen them in GT lists and not as illegal examples BTW

So if you have your own set of house rules go ahead!
If you would refuse to play a player that uses a BSB with a magic lance, go ahead.

But please don't try to impose your opinions in a rules forum.
We know you don't agree, so let's leave it at that.

I must agree with Tomahawk... it does not say the restrictions apply to magical items... it is strictly mundane, or non-magical, items. If they had wished to say "You cannot take any magical weapons or armor" they would have said so, no?

I shall email GW's Ruleboyz myself... I'm friends with some of them ever since I sent in some of my ideas for a few units...

It is not an interpretation of the rule, it is that it isn't clearly defined that you can't take a magical weapon that requires one hand to use... same with armor (although no magical shield... as his hands are taken up and can't use one

You could take a magical lance as long as it keeps in the mind that it is one-handed and is magical... if it is magical it is NOT mundane therefore it is not restricted... and not to mention it replaces the hand weapon.

You could also take a magical hand weapon as he already HAS a hand weapon... therefore you could easily replace that with something somewhat magical.

As long as the BSB isn't carrying a great weapon of any sort, it's fine. I just had to say my two cents in the defense of this rule... annd if you want hardcore proof, PM me and I will show you a letter from GW's Ruleboyz that will most likely agree with me.

(I love having friends in high places :D) You have to realize there is a strict difference between magical and mundane. If there is a restriction on Mundane, there is none on magical, if theres a restriction on magical, there is none on mundane... they must state both for it to link together.

So your interpretation of what should be right and wrong is up to you... but the rules speak for themselves out here... and if you wish to restrict your BSB from his full potential, that is fine, if you wish to play by your rules that's great... but I advise not to complain about it when it comes to official statements that are provided with proof and have even been seen in such things as tournaments.

"should" is highly opinional, relative and wishful thinking. GW just published a new Rulebook, the perfect opportunity to include smaller and larger changes to such details, and guess what - they didn't amend that rule (although a couple of others have seen various amounts of change/tweaking/rewriting. We shall have to assume they mean it how it's written.

In the descriptions for the various weapons,if it is a lance,it says it is.Same goes for GW's,morningstars,spears,etc.

Utter rubbish. All the "lances", "morningstars" and "crossbows" are nothing but fluff-talking when it comes to magical weapons, as it specifically says that magical weapons are not subject to the special rules of their mundane counterparts, except where mentioned in the description!

Thus, whenever it says "morning star of this" or "golden lance of that", what it really (meaning rules-wise) means is "default magical weapon - see description for ALL RELEVANT details". And no, it isn't a "default magical handweapon", either. There's no such thing as handweapons, or rules for spears/greatweapons etc. for the magical weapon rules.

I challenge you (while we're at it) to take a look at the Rulebook from time to time, and then make some quality posts in this Section of the Forum.

i remember that in 5th edition of WFB there was some explanation to magical items.

It was written that the name of magic item doesnt matter.

Explanation was simple: there is a lot of magical swords but only few of magical weapons are named axes lances etc. So the rule was that any magical weapon works like it was/is written on it and it doesnt really matter if that is axe sword club or whatever.

If i will find it i will quote but i dont remember now where to look for ..i think it was magic supplement.

edit:

Warhammer Magic page 32 paragraf: Type of Weapons.

Most magical weapons are swords, although there are a few which represent axes, lances etc. In general, although weapons are described as swords, it is perfectly reasonable to ascribe the weapon to a character model which carries a different type of weapon such as axe or mace. Simply assume the weapon has the properties ascribed to it on the Magic Weapon card, so the Sword of Fortitude becomes a Spear of Fortitude to all intents.

Whilst it is reasonable to ascribe magical properties to any type of weapon a model might carry, the model must ignore any special rules which would normally apply to the weapon. So, no extra bonuses apply for spears, double-handed weapons, lances etc. Similarly, the penalties that apply to double-handed weapons do not apply when they are wielded as magic weapons. The process of permitting models to count their weapons as magical is a convenience, and players must be prepared to lose weapon bonuses in order to keep things fair.

In the case of magical weapons which are specifically described as lances, double-handed weapons or other weapons which would ordinarily confer special bonuses, these bonuses are always included on the descriptive card if they apply (for example the Star Lance).

So we can use The Lance of Artois as a Sword of Artois but this sword wil give +2 bonus only on round when we charge and Killing blow also in the round of our charge.

Where is the rule saying the BSB can't take a lance? There's a rule saying he can't take any other mundane equipment, but that he is allowed to take magical equipment (up to 50 pts) if he doesn't take a magical banner. There's another rule saying that the BSB can't take weapons that require two hands to use. There's yet another rule saying you can't take magical armour if you can't take its mundane equivalent.

So there are three sorts of equipment the BSB cannot take: mundane equipment, magical equipment that requires two hands to use, and magical shields.

There is no rule saying that you cannot take a magical weapon if you don't have access to its mundane equivalent. Thus the magical lances, and the Morning Star of Fracasse, are legitimate choices for the BSB.

@Ursus - I don't know what you saw at the warhammer forum (or actually, if it was the 'Ascribe magic item' thread then I do, and people were quoting what they thought the rules said instead of what the rules actually say), but the old 6th ed. FAQ from the studio (now removed) didn't stop the BSB from taking a lance and the 7th ed. FAQ from the studio isn't

posted there yet. Anything else on that forum is just opinion.

I have run into a qualm with regards to this.

On page 43 of the army book it says under questing vow it says questing knights are not allowed to weild either mundane or magical lances.

This does not directly relate to BSB's but it was mentioned in here that because "lance" is not in the special text of a magic lance but rather only in the name, it is actually just considered a magic weapon of any sort you want. but ends up having the special abilities of a lance (+2 charge for instance). In a sense based on your interpretation of this it would mean that questing knights actually could carry the magic item named "heartwood lance" or any of the rest of them for that matter, as the special text with them does not designate them as lances, only the name does.

This obviously goes against the idea the rules meant to apply. This means they made a mistake in the rules. It relates to the BSB because the wording that the BSB is not allowed to carry ANY equipment (it does not say any mundane equipment, just like it also does not say any magical or mundane equipment. You assume that because it does not strictly prohibit magical equipment that it is only considering mundane equipment. When in fact the better assumption would be that it covers ANY equipment as it says which would include both magical and mundane in the restriction)

Does this correlation make sense?

Basically I am saying that since they obviously are assuming magical weapons with the word lance in the name are considered magical lances, they worded the rule on page 43 to cover that assumption. Likewise, it makes sense that when they worded the BSB to not be able to carry ANY equipment, they assumed it covered both magical and mundane.

I don't have the rulebook in front of me so I really hope it says the word "any", like I thought it did, otherwise i'll look like an idiot here! :unsure:

Any is correct but as a paladin he still can buy 50 points of magic items, only if he takes a magic banner he cannot take 50 points of magic items... this is the alinea above the any equipment.

Not any extra equipment is pretty poor wording by GW especially if you look at the alinea above it.

But if you take it as forbidding magic items, please remember a magic banner is a magic item. If the BSB cannot take a magic banner what's the point of the Banner of the lady?

A questing vow BSB cannot take a (magic) lance because of the rules on page 43. Heartwood lance etc... are still a magic lance in description. A similair rule could be added to prevent any BSB to take a magic lance/GW.

Basically I am saying that since they obviously are assuming magical weapons with the word lance in the name are considered magical lances

I counter with a quote from earlier in the thread page 121 of the 7th edition rulebook(page 152 of the BRB) states in the section about Magic Weapons: I paraphrase:
Magic Weapons allways ignore all special rules that would apply to normal weapons.
All rules that apply are covered in the magic weapon description.

So unless specific forbidden they can be taken as magic weapon...

I know it feels wrong but the rules are what they are.
Poorly worded by GW design staff.

For the moment a Magic lance for a BSB falls within the limits of the warhammer rules.
GW is now for a time promising to bring out a new FAQ, but unittl now they have not yet delivered their promise.

With the support forums for Warhammer closing down on their site, I doubt the FAQ has any real priority with them.

I don't use a magic lance on a BSB, but sometimes I use the sword of might or biting blade.

That has never been a point of debate with any opponent or tournament officials.

Since no new points have come forward I plan to close and condense this thread in about a week.

A questing vow BSB cannot take a (magic) lance because of the rules on page 43.

If part of the name of a magic weapon is a lance, it is a magic lance.

This is in relation to the rule on page 43 where questing character cannot use a lance or magic lance.

But all the rulesthe magic lance follows are not the normal lance rules but it is a weapon with the properties as mentioned in it's description.

In Bretonnian magic weapon description all magic lances do follow the lance rules but only because they are in the description. So in effect they are magic handweapons, but can give a +2 Strengthbonus on the charge if the character is mounted, in addition to any other rules the description of a particular lance.

Bretonnia BSB can use magic Items-> thus magic weapons.

No exceptions are made for magic lances so they are a legal option.

Yes the rules are pretty shaky and badly designed by GW.

So if you don't like it, please complain to the GW design staff.

They don't seem to listen but you can try:)

Maybe they will close their emailaddresses as well as their forums so they don't have to listen to their customers ever again..

If I had my way with the rules this particular loophole would allready be closed.

I will not use this loophole but for now it is legal, for as long as GW permits it.

However the BSB clearly can't use a shield Why not? because his other arm is holding a Banner presumably?

This alone would prevent me giving a 2 handed weapon to my BSB.

The problem is knights with banners in normal units can use shields and Great Weapons whereas the BSB has all the restrictions put on him/her. Why is this?

Surely a paladin is stronger more skilled than you average banner Bearing knight in a unit. The logic of reducing the effectiveness of one of our compulsory troop purchases eludes me at present.

Do other armies have the same BSB restrictions as we do?

I'm new to Warhammer so please forgive my ignorance re other armies BSB's.
