There are no credible rumors of a new army book. None. Nada. ZIP! There was a thread about some artist sketches for Bretonnian themes.

There ARE rumors of a release of Dark Eldar in 40K sometime this fall. There ARE rumors of a PDF for Inquisition armies in 40K.

There is talk that no new fantasy armies will come out until sometime next year. The oldest army books are currently Tomb Kings, Ogres, Wood Elves, Bretonnians, and Dwarves. These five army books were all released in 6th edition.

I suspect that Tomb Kings, Wood Elves, and Ogres will see new army books before Bretonnians. The rules for Tomb Kings Incantation and Ogre Kingdom's Gut Magic do not fit well with eighth edition rules set. Wood Elves play quite differently than they did in prior editions. I place all three armies ahead of Bretonnians in the Queue.

It appears that army books are coming out much more slowly. I do not mind, if the result is better balance. However, it looks like six months is the time between new release now. That would push the next fantasy army to January 2011 at the earliest. I do not see Bretonnians getting a new book before July 2012 or so.

This is all conjecture based on observations. I have no inside source to GW. However, I play Space Orks in 40K and waited many years before seeing a new codex.

Incantations are NOT bound spells. They have a separate set of rules, which is why Tomb Kings casting phase is so vicious.

Tomb Kings have the oldest army book. They were weak before, but received a massive boost in the magic phase from the latest edition. With that said, they do not fit cleanly with the new system. I have no proof, but I would expect them to be the next army book to come out.

Wood Elves seem to have the biggest problems adjusting to the new edition. The emphasis on banners, lack of ranked infantry, and likelihood of forests just eating their troops is bad for wood elves. The units that they need to take are not the "usual suspects". Wood Elves are a skirmish army in a game that emphasizes ranks and banners. This is another book I can see released before we get a revision.

Ogre Kingdoms have only received one army book. Their tie-ins with Dogs of War are gone. Gut Magic is a little weird, but definitely viable. Just to make the magic phase more consistent, I can see them getting a revision fairly soon. However, they received a huge boost with reclassification as monstrous infantry. I can see them doing well for the foreseeable future.

Dwarves received their second book just before the seventh edition came out. There are complaints from players about their Anvil of Doom not having a counter. With that said, I doubt there is a significant problem with Dwarves. I do not expect a revision of their book in the immediate future, especially since Gav Thorpe is no longer running things.

Bretonnians have probably the most limited model range of any army. Some variety would be nice. Removal of the 0-1 limits would be very nice. We have an older army book. However, unlike the Ravening Hordes lists, we have a viable army list. It definitely needs updating at some point (for variety and clarifications), but it is certainly playable. As long as the Watch Tower scenario remains, an all-cavalry army will not be reliable.

Orcs and Goblins do have some definite weaknesses. These are primarily on the Goblin side of the army, where points values were raised a bit much in seventh edition. However, orcs are quite viable. I seriously doubt that O&G will be the next book released. However, they do have a bunch of new models so it is an outside possibility.

Empire received a new book around the start of seventh edition. They have a lot of artillery choices. If the price of their mortars and cannons went up, then I would not complain. However, I doubt they are a likely update at any time soon.

I doubt that any of the remaining armies will be revised in the next few years. High Elves and Skaven are in the starter sets. Chaos Demons/ Warriors/ Beastmen are all viable and fairly new. Dark Elves and Lizardmen have fairly new books. Vampire Counts took a hit, but it may force them to take a mix of units.

If I were to hazard a guess, I would order the release of new books something like this:

- 1) Tomb Kings
- 2) Wood Elves (a switch of 1 and 2 would not surprise me)
- 3) Ogre Kingdoms
- 4) Bretonnia (a switch of 3 and 4 would not surprise me)
- 5) Orcs and Goblins
- 6) Dwarves
- 7) Vampire Counts
- 8) Empire (5,6,7, and 8 could be in any order)
- 9) Dark Elves

I can see why orcs and goblins deserve a new book. Many orc and goblins players were screwed over with the current army book. I quit playing them when their "new" book came out. Orcs were improved when the seventh edition army book came out, but goblin armies were severely impacted.

Essentially, they screwed over goblin armies. Both the base cost and upgrade costs of goblins increased. Night goblins come with shields; their basic cost was increased 50% between 6th and 7th editions. They now cost more than skaven slaves (even with shields), and have fewer abilities. In addition, night goblin fanatics were nerfed. As a side note: a goblin with spear, shield, and light armor costs the same as a man at arms with a spear, shield, and light armor. Goblins just have better leadership and worse initiative than men at arms. (Which explains complaints about the cost of men at arms...)

Currently, the most devastating magic phase may belong to the orc and goblin player. Mork's Spirit Totem adds dispel dice (usually three). Idol of Mork adds power dice equal to the number of large orc units in combat within 24". Other items impact the magic phase (staff of sneaky stealing, etc.). The low cost of the spells make them very easy to get off.

Toss the effigy of mork, glittering scales, and the gork'll fix it spell on a warboss and the result is a character that almost cannot be hit in close combat (-2 to hit with rolls of sixes treated as ones).

Orcs and goblins are probably the most popular army. They have recently received new plastic models, and can certainly use a new book. If they receive the next new book, it would bring them in line with other armies.

I suspect that Khemri requires a new model line, and that is causing a bit of delay for them. In addition, Ogre Kingdoms and Wood Elves need new books more than Bretonnians. I would not expect another book until 2013.

I could not find any new posts by Avian. The one post of his that I found on army book sequences may have been a year ago. The post I found suggested that the new edition may come out in 2010 and not in 2011. I am not certain how current the reference thread is.

Dwarves got two books in sixth edition fantasy.

Right now, army books are coming out slower. At the start of sixth edition, the promise was four per year. Then it slowed to three per year. Now, it looks to be about one this year (Beastmen) and maybe two books next year. I can deal with an eight-ten year life cycle for army books.

I feel better if the army book is done properly and not rushed. In Third edition 40K, GW left the weapons table out of the Space Ork Codex. You were stuck using the main rulebook for a list of what your weapons did. When fourth edition came out, it was a problem to reference the third edition rulebook for a list of what your weapons did. :P After about seven years, GW finally edited the back page of the Ork Codex and included a weapons chart. The new ork codex was released a few months before the fifth edition came out.

What I do NOT want to see is another f'd up campaign book released. The Storm of Chaos Campaign book ruined play balance with the half-***ed army lists. Yes, campaign lists in white dwarf can be fluffy. No to untested lists published in books.

Basically, this means that no new army books will be released over the next few months. Expect nothing in February or March either: Lord of the Rings and 40K will have slots over a few months. Whatever Fantasy army gets released, it will probably be around April or so.

Skaven second wave releases in January are confirmed. These are mostly models based on the starter set. The general discussion on various websites suggests Blood Angels (from 40K)in February as part of their second wave. Greenskins are supposed to get a new book in March. This rumor has been floating a long time, and seems to have gained some teeth.

GW has definitely slowed down the update of army books. If Orcs and Goblins are in March, the next book would not be released for another six months. With Tomb Kings characters being pulled from shelves now, I suggest they would be the follow up army book next Fall.

As far as Bretonnians go, I do not expect a new Army Book before 2012. With Wood Elves and Ogre Kingdoms on a short list as well, I could see our book even getting pushed back to February 2013 or so. The 8th edition has lead to infantry being a lot more effective step-up, steadfast, fighting in 2 ranks. Bretonnian's are meant to be a cavalary themed army and I am seeing all cavalry lists struggle. If you do the maths and play the games i'm afraid lances are just not going to win those fights against equal points blocks of infantry.

Many years ago, Gav Thorpe wrote some articles that were posted on the GW website. One of them discussed the relationships between the various chaos gods, and similar manifestations.

Khaine was described as 90% Khorne, and maybe 10% Slanesh. Basically the act of murder required a bit of style and finesse, not just crude butchery. Similarly the Horned Rat was maybe 75% Nurgle and 25% Tzeentch. Mostly about decay (nurgle), but also having the mutations from rat to skaven (change belonging to tzeentch).

Since I also play orcs and goblins, I can say that many problems exist for the current rules set. There is no good reason to run common goblins instead of night goblins, other than as an odd character.

One serious issue with Orcs and Goblins is the way their magic system is out of whack with everything else. A couple of spells, Waaagh! and Hand of Gork, allow their units to charge during the magic phase. Many spells that used to allow that effect disappeared from the latest edition (i.e. Steed of Shadows allows movement, not a charge...). Their miscast table has issues as well.

As it will be the first book out under the new edition, the O&G book will give some interesting hints. If rock lobbas go up in price, then war machines will go up in price for everyone. I would not be surprised if the spear chukkas keep the 2:1 selection, but I can also see them becoming a normal, 1:1 selection.
